Beautification matters. When our community looks its best, it fosters a sense of pride, ensures resident safety, and contributes to a healthier and more enjoyable living experience.

As proud members of District 1, it's our shared responsibility to ensure we keep our neighborhoods vibrant. From removing hazardous materials and debris to maintaining clean streets, it's critical to understand your Birmingham City Codes and common misconceptions that lead to violations.

Top Three Code Violations

1) Parking Your Car On The Grass: Contrary to popular belief, this is not allowed. Grass parking can lead to soil compaction, which can cause erosion and runoff issues. Beyond that, it creates an impression of neglect. So please help us keep District 1 vibrant and inviting!

Residents can be fined \$50 per vehicle, per day for parking in their yard

- 2) Improper Trash Pickup: The City of Birmingham recently invested in new uniform trash bins for all households in the city. However, leaving cans on the curb for more than 24-hours is a common code violation. Also, all trash must be placed inside the bin; anything propped up on the outside or stacked on top will not be collected and leads to litter being spread around in our streets.
- 3) Bulk Trash: Bulk trash pickup happens once a month in all of Birmingham's 99 neighborhoods. Too often we observe residents leaving huge piles of trash out weeks in advance. Do your neighbors a favor; find out when your neighborhood is scheduled for bulk trash pick up and what items are allowed.

Residents can be fined up to \$1,000 for illegal dumping of bulk items
